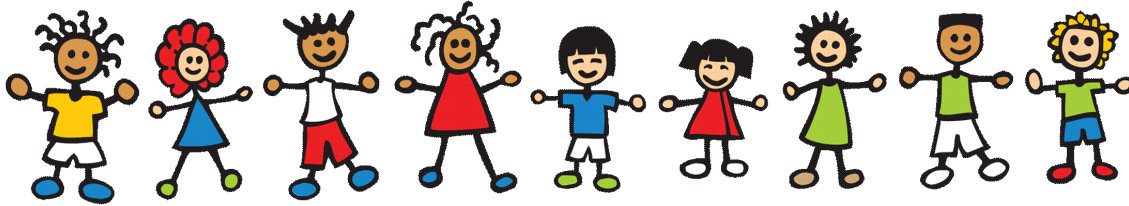


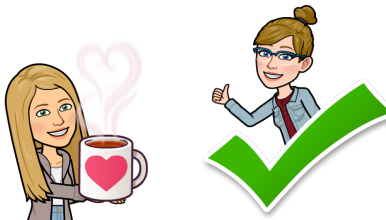

Your child's agenda is another wonderful communication tool. If you write a brief note in the agenda, we will see it right away, as we check agendas first thing every morning. **Please remember to check and sign your child's agenda every day, as it will highlight important events and reminders.**

In an effort to ensure you receive timely information and understand what your child is learning, we will be sending out newsletters by email containing class information. Some of it is repetitive from the monthly CCA newsletter; however, our lives are busy, and this is just one more way to ensure you know what is happening. How We Run Our Love and Logic Classrooms

During the first week of school, we will create "Our Classroom Promise" with the students. We want to involve the children in establishing our classroom culture and expectations, because we find they "buy into" it more. In general, we have found that if children understand the behavioural expectations from the beginning of the school year, and we consistently reinforce them, it minimizes many difficulties.

Love and Logic is an approach we use in the classroom to create a safe and caring environment. It guides and empowers children to develop positive relationships, empathy, respect, and accountability. It also fosters the ability to gain independence and become a problem solver.

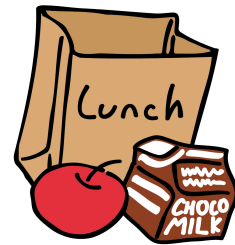
GUIDING PRINCIPLES:

- I will treat you with respect, so you will know how to treat me.
- Feel free to do anything that doesn't cause a problem for anyone else.
- If you cause a problem, I will ask you to solve it.
- If you can't solve the problem, or choose not to, I will do something.
- What I do will depend on the special person and the special situation.
- If you feel something is unfair, whisper to me "I'm not sure that's fair," and we will talk.

LUNCHES AND WATERBOTTLES

The children will be eating their snack and lunch in their classroom. They will not have access to a microwave, so if they have warm food it must be sent in a thermos. In health, we discuss healthy choices and what the human body needs, therefore we encourage students to eat their main dish first at lunch and then they can have their treats last. We encourage you to pack healthy snacks for your child, such as fruit, cheese, crackers, veggies, and granola bars.



We are continuing with the Boomerang lunch program this year. This means that what students "pack in," they also "pack out." Any garbage, juice boxes, or ziplocks need to be put back into their lunch kits and taken home. As a school, we are now producing 3 times less the amount of garbage than we used to. That's pretty amazing!

Please be sure to send a labelled water bottle with your child each day. We recommend water bottles with auto seal or auto spout to minimize spills or leaks in your child's backpack.

Home Reading Program – The Amazing Race - Reading Across the World!

We will be implementing a home reading incentive program to encourage your child to be reading at home daily. Please support them by carving out time that they can be cuddling up at home with a good book. We will also be planning other fun reading events like Book Tastings and Book Bistros. Stay tuned to learn more about how we will be transforming into a classroom full of avid readers this year!



BIBLE MEMORY

The children will be provided with a series of Bible verses that relate to the topics of study in their Bible program. In Grade 3 this year, the students will work on a new verse every week or two. There will be a few “catch up” weeks planned into our Bible Memory schedule as well, to help keep students on track. At the end of the year, children who are successful in their Bible memory will be rewarded with a scripture memory medal. We will email and send home a hard copy of our Bible memory verses in the coming weeks.

DAILY PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

We believe in the importance of moving your body, and daily physical activity is mandated in Alberta classrooms. We have seen that physical exercise fuels the learning process in children. Your children will participate in daily recesses, gym time, SPARK, active living walks, and fun body breaks in the classroom. The students will get lots of physical movement during the day. We will be keeping movement and exercise a priority in our classrooms.

SCHOOL WORK

We strive to give Grade 3 students ample time to complete their learning tasks during class time. That being said, from time to time, a child will not finish their work on a given day, and this work will be sent home to be completed and returned, as soon as possible. If your child will be away from school for more than a couple of days, it would be beneficial for you to let us know and we can send home any important work that they will be missing. Thank you for your cooperation with this!

MY BLUEPRINT

Rocky View Schools is using the myBlueprint program as a tool to facilitate student reflection and learning. myBlueprint is a kid-friendly, interactive portfolio tool that allows K-6 students to reflect on their learning, showcase their growth, and share their achievements. They can easily navigate through the portfolio, explore occupations, write journal entries, set goals, and upload files, pictures, videos, drawings, and audio recordings. myBlueprint can be accessed by each student’s family. Your child’s teacher will send a request to your email address. Stay tuned for an email regarding myBlueprint parent access from your child's teacher in the coming weeks.

What to Bring (& What not to Bring)

This year we are asking each child to bring in a set of good quality headphones for computer (iPad) use in a large ziplock bag (labelled with their name) and a clipboard with your child to hold their work when we are outdoors or learning in alternative

spaces. We would like to take our learning outside as much as possible. We find that connecting to nature lowers anxiety and fuels that love and appreciation for God's amazing creation!

We are asking that students not bring in personal toys or pieces of technology from home. We find that it can become a distraction in the classroom or can get misplaced. We appreciate your support in keeping our classroom a place where students can focus and learn.



VOLUNTEERING

We are so excited to have volunteers in our school again this year! We are looking for one parent to volunteer from each class to be the classroom coordinator for all parent volunteering. Once our permanent schedule is completed after the Thanksgiving weekend, we will email all families and let them know what days are available for volunteering and who our New Classroom Coordinator is. This person will also assist in coordinating help for special events. We really appreciate parent volunteers. You can expect to do photocopying and collating of mini-books, bulletin board work, reading with students, helping prepare materials for art projects, and things of this nature. Please note that ALL classroom and field trip volunteers must have the Police Check and security clearance forms completed and approved before volunteering. If you require a security clearance, please see the CCA office staff for forms and information.

FIELD TRIPS AND CLASS OUTINGS

We are excited to be offering field trips again this year. We hope to attend approximately 3-4 field trips during the school year that will require entrance fees and busing costs. In the past, these field trips have been to the Calgary Farmyard, Glenbow Ranch, Telus Spark Science Centre, Cochrane Gymnastics, Calgary Zoo, and Calaway Park. In addition, there will be a couple of field trips that only require busing. CCA always tries to keep these costs reasonable and coordinate with other classes to spread out the busing costs.



BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

Birthdays are a special time for students, and we recognize and celebrate each child on their birthday. Parents are invited to send in treats as per guidance that will soon be given from the CCA office – stay tuned! Summer

birthdays will be celebrated within the month of June.
